Cindy Dayton from Aribex is a can't-live-without assistant.

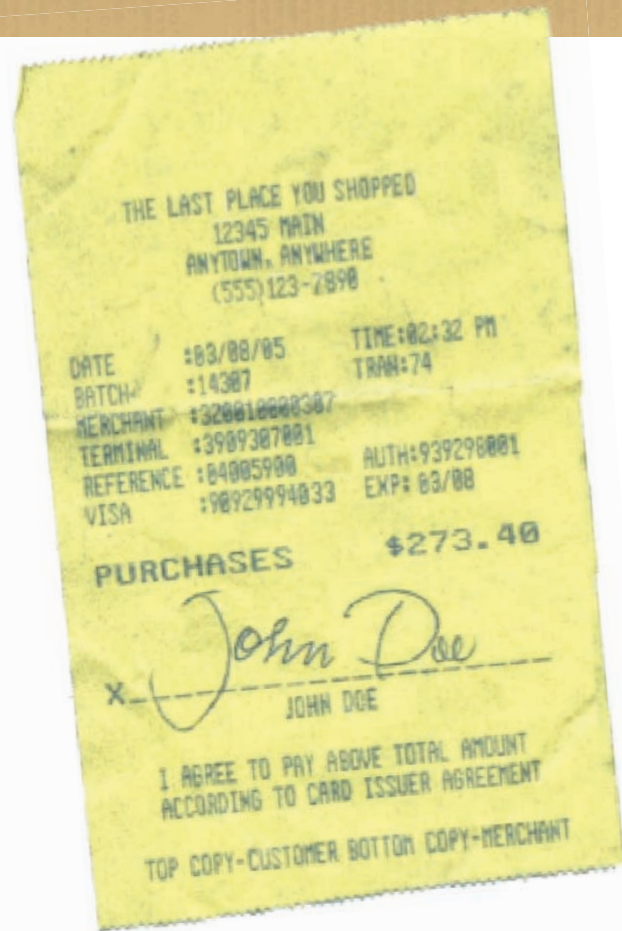
